## Broken femur baby

A 2 month old child is brought to your A&E department with a grossly swollen right upper leg. It has been X-rayed from triage and this shows a fractured femur. Mum says she rolled off the bed when she wasn't looking.

Apart from analgesia (next question) what would be your approach to the child? (1 mark)

ABCD. Check in particular CRT and other C indices. Gain iv access. Oxygen

What analgesia could you provide for the child (3 marks)

Splinting
Iv opiates
Femoral nerve block/catheter

The nurse says this sounds like a suspicious injury. What features in the history would make you suspect non-accidental injury? (2 marks)

Delay in presentation
History inconsistent with development
Injuries inconsistent with history
Vague history
Changing history
Abnormal parental attitude/affect/concern
Frequent attendances

What features in the examination would make you suspect NAI? (2 marks)

Bilateral bruising esp to the eye
Bruising to non-trauma areas eg medial arms and thigh
Imprints of belts, teeth, slap
Bruising in a pre-toddler
Facial petechiae

What age would you expect a child to do these things? (2 marks)

Roll over 2-4 months
Sit up 6 months
Walk alone 1 year
Have finger-thumb grasp 9 months
