Recent trauma, surgery, medical illness, or immobilisation from any other cause; especially in the presence of known thrombophilia, previous venous thromboembolism, pregnancy, puerperium, age over 40 years, obesity, varicose veins, oestrogen use, malignancy, heart failure, inflammatory bowel disease, or nephrotic syndrome

4. The patients in whom VTE can be excluded varies from hospital to hospital. Explain this.

3 marks

1 mark hospitals use different test kits

1 mark "sensitivity/specificity"

1 mark "low/medium risk groups" OR "pre-test probability"

5. How would you manage this patient if a DVT was confirmed? Why? 1 mark

1 mark for Heparin. 1 mark for Warfarin is teratogenic, contraindicated in pregnancy.
